Amanda said that VIC and the football club had forged a close relationship after money raised during a Remembrance football match was donated to VIC.


Special mugs were created with the Bury AFC logo and Lest We Forget.

The proceeds of the event were split between The Firefighters Charity and VIC and we are very grateful for the £550.










THE VIC Choir had a terrific reception at Asda in Rawtenstall and raised £420.94.

During lockdown, groups were asked to knit or crochet hearts to unite families who were not able to see their loved ones in hospital due to Covid.


Ivy Limbrick saw a request on Facebook by Val Hogan and shared it with the group to see if they wanted to take part.

FALKLANDS' veteran Steve Butterworth, has launched a Facebook community group called Poems, Songs and Writings about the Falklands Conflict.

Steve, who is also an Outreach Worker at Veterans In Communities, hopes to encourage fellow Falklands' veterans to join the group and share their own thoughts and feelings.

He said, the group so far had 127 members nationwide and had become a safe environment for them to share their feelings about the Falklands War.

Steve, from Holcombe Brook, spent eight years in the Navy and was on HMS Intrepid in the Falklands, working as a catering accountant and medic – helping the wounded.

Steve said: "I have ideas for what this group can achieve. I would like to collect everyone's writing and poetry to publish a book, filled with all our individual experiences.

"I want others to understand what we have been through. A book could perhaps be a lasting memory for what we have to say.

"Some of the members write songs, which cannot be printed into a book. I would like there to be a live performance, where these veterans can sing what they have written and read their poetry.

"Some of the writing is deep and dark. Someone

wrote 'even the shadows had shadows' when talking about the Battle of Goose Green, which stuck with me.

"When I first came out of the Navy, I never spoke about what happened, but I found that writing poetry was a form of escapism for me, and it led me to write a poem Pale Maiden, which was made into a song and recorded.

"More recently, I have considered how wars do not only affect those that go, but also the families that are left behind."

Steve recently wrote a poem called 'Letter to Dad,' and in it he speaks to his father, who sadly passed away at 52 years old – just three years after Steve left the Navy.
