Making our allotment grow

EIGHT years ago, we took on an abandoned piece of land off Holcombe Road, Helmshore, and began work to turn the area into an allotment.

Now, thanks to the hard work of Sam and otheres, the area has new greenhouses and raised beds, flowers, fruit, veg and wildlife.

Operations Manager Bob Elliott said: "The progress that has been made this year has been amazing. This is exactly how we wanted the allotment to be when we first took it over in 2015.

"At that time, it was totally derelict and was a dumping ground for asbestos and all sorts of rubbish which had to be cleared up before work could begin.

"A number of people have been involved in the allotment over the years, but we have struggled to have time to commit to it.

"Now Sam has come on board, and can spend the time that is needed, the area has been transformed. Sam also gets a lot out of looking after the allotment."

The area used to have a polytunnel and a shed, but now has two greenhouses that have been donated, lots of raised beds that have been built with tops made to secure the young plants from bugs.

It is full of plants which are being grown to support pollinators and other projects VIC is involved with. The area has become a haven for wildlife including damselflies, many different birds, a pair of robins and nesting bluetits.

Paving stones have been spread about to make a rough path through the area. It has been weeded and, thanks to Alan, the area has been strimmed.

Bob added: "We want to say a big thank you to Sam, it is looking great."

"The classes are a way for me to give back to the community – in a way that is better than any medication.

"The sessions have allowed many people, from a range of backgrounds and ages between 11 and 86, to develop new confidence in their artistic skills and this has allowed them to adapt any piece of artwork into something of a Bob Ross style.

"The sessions are perfect for stress-relief and I encourage imperfection in the artwork that they make. It is important for them to enjoy the experience. The end result is secondary."
