At a recent Battlefields Tour meeting at the VIC Centre in Haslingden, some of the arrangements were finalised and hotels and ferry crossings are in the process of being booked.

On September 9 2024, the party will leave Haslingden, drive to Portsmouth and catch the ferry to Le Havre, followed by a short drive to Caen for two nights.

On Tuesday and Wednesday they will visit Arromanche, Juno, Pegasus Bridge and Caen, but there is some flexibility where they visit.

On Wednesday they will stay overnight in the Amien area and the party can visit some of the First World War sites before crossing into Belgium to Menin Gate where they will observe the nightly Last Post.

On the Thursday night, they are hoping to stay at the Talbot House hotel in Poperinge, which was used during the First World War as an R&R centre.

Finally, on Friday, the tour will travel to Calais, board a ferry to Dover and drive back to Haslingden.

The approximate cost is £400 per person which includes accommodation, breakfast and evening meals. It is expected to be shared accommodation where appropriate to keep the costs down, which we will all have experienced during our service.
